## Responding to Partners Double or Overcall

After partners **double** you can do 1 of 4 things;

1. Pass but only if there has been an intermediate bid or you are SURE that you can take the opponents off in their suit. You need at least 6 good cards in their suit and a couple of aces. EG

2. You can bid your longest suit at the minimum level. (this promises 0-9 TPs and may only be 4 cards in length.) If your 4 card suit is the oppositions suit and you are balanced you can bid NT.

3. You can make a jump bid in your best suit. (This may still only have 4 cards in length but will have 10-11 Tps.).

4. You can bid the oppositions suit. This is artificial because you do not have that suit. It shows an opening hand and is forcing to game.

## After partners **Overcall** you can do 1 of 4 things;

1. Pass. Terrible hand cant even compete. Probably less than eight points and no fit for partner.

2. Bid your own suit. You need at least 5 cards in your suit and 8 pts if you can bid it at the 1 level but if you have to go to the 2 level you need 10+.

3. Raise partners suit. Usually 6-10TPs. With 4 card support bid to the 3 level.

4. Bid the oppositions suit. Very constructive bid and asks partner how strong the overcall is. It requires 10+TPs if you have a fit with partner and 12 pts if no fit (looking for NT).
